Open House at 200 East Station Street

Part one of a two part project has been completed. Council chambers and a community facility have been constructed at 200 East Station Street. On February 7th from 6:00 to 7:00 PM there will be an open house prior to the regularly scheduled council meeting. In addition to the council chambers, a re-

A New Year Results in New Rates for Refuse Removal

For residential refuse removal the rate will go from \$13.88 to \$14.86 in the March bill. This is the result of a \$3/ton fee by SWACO. SWACO handles the transfer facility and landfill. They are passing along an OhioEPA fee. The additional 68¢ is from the 2009 contract that can be reviewed at our website: ashvilleohio.gov under Services-Refuse.
